Dear Parents, Carers, Staff and Students

Connection provides purpose and meaning in our lives. It is ultimately why we are here. Scientists tell us we are neuro-biologically wired for connection which leads to satisfaction in our lives. Yet the key ingredient that leads to connection is vulnerability. Unless we are prepared to open ourselves up to what we don't know or believe, we cannot build on understanding. In order to be connected we need to be seen wholeheartedly.

Psychologist Brene Brown describes courage, compassion and connection as the enablers to vulnerability. Courage provides us the strength to tell our story of who we are from our whole heart. It provides us the power to be imperfect and believe that we are worthy. Compassion gives us the gift to be kind to ourselves first, then to others. We cannot be compassionate to others if we cannot be kind to ourselves first. Connection is a result of authenticity. It allows us to let go of who we think we should be in order to be who we are. These three enablers create vulnerability. Brown argues, 'Vulnerability should not be seen as the core of shame, fear and struggle, but it is the birthplace of joy, creativity, belonging and love'. We cannot selectively numb our emotions. If we numb vulnerability, then we numb joy, gratitude and happiness. We cannot find purpose and meaning without these. Nonetheless vulnerability is still an uncomfortable emotion.

Our world today makes everything uncertain. Plastic surgery focuses on the imperfections that make us beautiful to create our bodies in images of what we think they should be. Our faith is less about the mystery and more about definitive answers. We perfect so that there is no struggle or vulnerability. Yet our children are hard wired for struggle when they arrive in our world. From the lasting image when we hold our own child in our arms for the very first time, our job is to not say they are perfect and to keep them perfect. Our job is to not fast track them through primary school, ensuring they make an elite basketball squad by nine years of age and receive a scholarship for academic brilliance. Our job is to not protect them from struggle and vulnerability but to let them experience it in order to grow and make connections. Our job is to say that they are imperfect, because the very thing that makes them vulnerable makes them beautiful.

Our school community is not about limiting struggle, but providing environments where we can be vulnerable with our learning to make deep and authentic connections. As we prepare transition and orientation experiences for students in preparation for 2019 in the coming weeks, we know our students will face struggle. They may not have their best friend in their class, or the Teacher they were hoping for, but these experiences of struggle are growth points that will make our students stronger and richer learners in the long run.

Testing -

All our students are assessed informally and formally throughout the year, with a focus on preand post- assessment. This enables teachers to gain insight into student progress, and to also target teach according to point of need.

Included in our testing, is the Literacy and Numeracy PAT Assessment, which is a diagnostic test coordinated through the Australian Council of Educational Research (ACER). PAT Assessments are a series of tests designed to provide objective, norm-referenced information to teachers about their students' skills and understandings in a range of key areas. This information provides additional valuable data for our teachers as they track our students throughout the school year and beyond. Formal testing is administered in May and November.
