Book Week activities and dress up for the students is next week? The focus of this year's Book Week is similar to last year in that we are encouraging books in classrooms and value them amongst the children's peers.

It provides an opportunity for children to have fun reading rather than it merely remaining as an activity done at school. Importantly research abounds that children who are read to and read regularly at home have an educational advantage, both cognitively and socially. This week is one way we celebrate not only books, but the value of reading.






EUCHARIST WORKSHOP

- A Treasure Hunt


Prizes will be announced at assembly the following Monday.
