#### **Principal's Reflection**

The way we live is changing. Each year, our free time shrinks a little more as computers clamour for an increasing percentage of our attention. We are in, a part of and a contributor to a computer age. The amazing contradiction of our age is not so much the ability to connect to such a wealth of information, but the apparent 'disconnect' that is so often associated with social media, one important aspect of our computer age.

Drawing from nationally representative surveys of eleven million young people as well as in-depth interviews, 'iGen', a recently published book by Dr Jean Twenge, is the first book to document the cultural changes shaping today's teens and young adults, documenting how their changed world has impacted their attitudes, world views, and mental health. With generational divides wider than ever, parents, educators, and employers have an urgent need to understand today's rising generation of teens and young adults.

Born after 1995, iGen is the first generation to spend their entire adolescence in the age of the smartphone. With social media and texting replacing other activities, iGen spends less time with their friends in person – perhaps why they are experiencing unprecedented levels of anxiety, depression, and loneliness. Dr Twenge's studies highlight the point that technology is not the only thing that makes iGen distinct from every generation before them; they are also different in how they spend their time, how they behave, and in their attitudes toward many topics; they socialise in completely new ways, reject once sacred social taboos, and want different things from their lives and careers.

Anxiety and depression are very, very closely related to each other - they are kind of two sides of the same coin. So, if you are seeing these links between electronic device time and depression and unhappiness, it is a pretty reasonable guess that you have see them with anxiety as well.

These recent, comprehensive studies are extremely interesting in that almost everything that you can do that is not on a screen is linked to more happiness; spending time with friends in person, going to religious services, sports and exercise, even homework. However, everything that is on a screen is linked to less happiness; social media use, internet, texting.

The book highlighted two studies that followed people over time and the results found that spending a lot of time on social media leads to unhappiness, but being unhappy doesn't lead to spending more time on social media. Another study randomly assigned people to give up their Facebook page for a week, or not. Those who gave up Facebook ended the week happier, less depressed and less lonely.

Parents and educators cannot afford to not be part of discussions regarding the influence of social media. We are in a moving age and working together is so important in understanding and supporting each other as we move through these times.

### NAPLAN – Grade 3 and 5's – Tuesday 15 - Thursday 17 May

Next week, Tuesday to Thursday. our Grade 3 and 5 classes will be involved in Naplan testing. Naplan is a National Assessment Program - for Literacy and Numeracy and is completed by all students throughout Australia in Grade's 3, 5, 7 and 9. The testing provides a small snapshot of data for parents and teachers. As well as these tests that are conducted for these year groups, it is important to recognise the significant amount of work that is done throughout the year in class assessment. Also, our school assessments provide teachers and parents through our reporting and parent/teacher conversation process, a rich source of information about each child's achievements.

#### **Confirmation - Sunday 20 May**

We have our confirmation candidates preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. As a school community can we have these students in our thoughts and prayers during this time. The candidates will attend a practice at the Cathedral on **Friday 18 May.** It is very exciting for these candidates to receive their sacrament at St Patrick's Cathedral on **Sunday 20 May at 2.30pm** from Archbishop Denis Hart.

- Family Groups are what the Catholic Church is based on; communities who know, care for and support each other through life's celebrations, challenges and tragedies.



During Lent we read about stories explaining the issues faced in different countries - Nepal, Cambodia, Philippines, Mozambique, Jordan and even Australia.


### How do we help others?
