Principal's Reflection

"Challenge of the day: Find something good in everyone and everything."

Author Unknown

Imagine a world where we saw the good in everyone and everything? A world where we enjoyed what we had rather than always wanting more. In the words of Louis Armstrong, "what a wonderful world it would be!" In our society today, we are continually tempted and persuaded to buy items that we, 'must simply have' in order to live a fulfilled life. We are led to believe that our lives would be so much better with these items, but how often do we stop and think - will this really make me happy or is this simply replacing something else that is missing in my life?

In reading an article recently on Mindfulness by Georgie Manning, he speaks about the practice of being mindful and to think and reflect on ways to incorporate Mindfulness strategies, such as deep breathing. One of the key take-outs was permission for a person to stop and to live in the moment and to be accepting of the world we live in and of who we are. Even sitting in traffic while waiting to get to work can be an opportunity to practise Mindfulness! It is important to know what is within our 'circle of control' and what is not. We should not waste precious moments in our lives over-thinking and stressing about events that have not yet happened or are in the past, which may prevent us from living a full life. In a world where approximately one in three students suffer some level of anxiety, it is evident that we need to teach Mindfulness strategies and acceptance to our students. We start each day with meditation which enables our students to clear their minds and to start a mindfulness approach.

A number of our staff recently attended a professional development with regard to our Positive Behaviour for Learning. This looked at resilience and "getting over it" - something which needs to be learned and practised as it does not come automatically to children or adults. This is very appropriate when thinking about Mindfulness strategies and finding ways to help ourselves to pause and reflect then move forward. In a world where instant gratification has become accepted, the challenge for parents and teachers is to show students how to be accepting of who they are and being grateful for what they have rather than always looking for the next thing.

During the week ahead, the challenge for everyone is to find something that makes you happy, such as a walk, reading with your child - really live in the moment as you do this activity. Don't worry about the email that you need to send or the phone call that you need to return during those few precious minutes. Enjoy the moment and live life to the full.

OUR LADY OF THE PINES PIETY STALL






AN AUSTRALIAN CREED
