Dear Parents, Carers, Staff and Students

Further from last week's newsletter item on technology and addiction to screens and technology, I believe it is pertinent to provide you with an article written by Martine Oglethorpe, who is an accredited speaker with the Office of the eSafety Commissioner and has presented in numerous parent groups, schools and to teachers. It is evident that a number of students in primary schools are playing the game *Fortnite*, some as young as six years old. This game has an age rating of 12+ (the age is set for most Year 7 students and above). Martine writes, working with kids in schools over the past weeks and indeed having kids of her own, has alerted her to the seemingly unprecedented obsession with the new online game of *Fortnite*. The following is the main body of her article.

Not since *Pokémon Go* has something seemed to take the world by storm, leaving parents wondering when it will ever stop. The answer to that last question is probably that it will stop when the next big thing comes along. These fads may well be a modern day version of the Rubik's Cube, elastics or swap cards, though of course the effects of the obsession can be much more pervasive than my childhood obsession with *PacMan*. If *Fortnite* is the latest craze to hit your household, or you are being nagged and cajoled to let them have the game "that everyone else is playing", then here are a few things you should know:

It is violent. The aim of the game is to be the last person standing, and in order to do that you must kill all the other players. However, the violence is portrayed as less real and almost cartoonish. There is no blood and gore as such, and so the violence is not comparable to that portrayed in other games such as *Call of Duty* or *Grand Theft Auto*. You can work in a team or on your own; working in a team can develop some effective teamwork skills. You can chat to team members but also random strangers who make up the remainder of the 100 players who are playing at the time. You can turn the chat function off by going to the settings and clicking on 'audio options'. This limits chatting to a player's friends or team members. Kids will be very loud playing this game so there is little chance of them playing it behind your back!

Each game goes for about 20 minutes, so it is an easy one to put time limits on by stipulating the number of games. It is frequently described as addictive therefore it is unlikely they will leave a game midway through. As with any new game, social network or fad, it is crucial that we familiarise ourselves with it. Have a game with them, play around with the app or read about what the possible dangers may be so that you can have the right conversations and put the right boundaries in place. Whilst there are certainly many areas of video gaming to be concerned about, it is also important to recognise that most video games can build skills and can also have social, emotional and cognitive benefits.

Of course, as from the first part of this reflection, age of users of games is used for a reason. *Fortnite* has a 12+ rating. The article was designed for students in Year 7. We have significant numbers of students in our school playing this game. The concerning part is so many students and parents are ignoring this recommendation. Children's emotional development and the detrimental effect these games have on students can be huge. As a school, and as a Principal, I ask parents to ask the question, why is my child playing this game? Is it age appropriate? If I am letting them play, what detrimental effects does this have for my child? We have a responsibility as parents and adults to set boundaries (***the game is for 12+ not primary age students***) and examples for our children and students, this is an example of a phenomenon that we can have control.

We will also be covering Dr Lyn Sharratt's work on the Learning Collaborative which will be looking at putting faces on the data, analysing data of all students at OLOP and future direction based around tracking, using data to be constructive in providing essential feedback to staff in learning all students learning outcomes.

Book Week - Monday 20 - Friday 24 August

A letter has been sent to parents outlining the activities for Book Week with dress up day being Monday, 20 August. We invite all students to get dressed in a book character. Parents this year are also invited to dress up, to come along and experience reading with their child in the classroom, following the parade in the gym at the start of the day.

Book Week is the longest running children's festival in Australia, with schools and public libraries everywhere celebrating authors and illustrators and in so doing, are valuing reading. It provides an opportunity for children to have fun reading rather than it merely remaining as an activity done at school. Importantly, research abounds that children who are read to and read regularly at home have an educational advantage, both cognitively and socially. This week is one way we celebrate not only books but the value of reading.

SIGNING IN AND OUT

Passtab is a visitor management software system, which has replaced the manual sign in/sign out books at the front desk. This is for the recording of students arriving late to school, leaving early, and for visitors and parent helpers.

It is most important that students arriving late to school are signed in by an adult parent/carer. Students are not permitted to sign themselves in. The same applies to students leaving school early. Visitors are requested to sign in and wear a lanyard during their time in the school.



AN INVITATION OLOP STEM DAY FRIDAY 10TH AUGUST 2018



Dear Parents & Carers

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) covers a wide range of disciplines and skills, which are increasingly in demand in our rapidly changing world. STEM education encourages students to work in teams using communication, collaboration and problem solving skills, while persisting with STEM challenges or projects.

In the Victorian Curriculum, the Learning Area, 'Technologies' comprises two strands, 'Design and Technologies' and 'Digital Technology'. The Engineering component of STEM is taught through the Design and Technologies strand and the Technology component is taught through the Digital Technologies strand.

The Department of Education and Training (DET) released a document in September, 2016, called "STEM in the Education State" which stated that there is "a greater need for STEM capabilities than ever before. Employers are increasingly looking for workers who are creative problem solvers, innovative and critical thinkers, and able to use new technologies". The Office of the Chief Scientist has suggested that 75% of the fastest growing occupations require STEM knowledge and yet overall student results in Australia in science and mathematics are declining.

Across the school, our classes participate in a large amount of STEM activities from hands on creations to coding and 3D cad design. The students use problem solving, mathematics, creativity and design to solve problems.

To showcase the students learning in STEM we would love to invite parents and friends to come and view students in action between 9- 11am on Friday the 10th August. If your child is in Code Club you are also welcome to stay during lunch and have a go at coding with your child!

On the day students can come to school in free dress for a gold coin donation. The money raised will go towards the purchase of more STEM resources. Students, staff and parents can dress up as their favourite Scientist, Technologists, Engineer or Mathematician!
